Advent is perhaps one of the most misunderstood seasons in the church year. The season of Advent is absolutely Christian. It is a season that is not yet Christmas. It's a period of waiting and preparation. A season of expectation. The Savior is coming! And we prepare and wait and cherish the time.

We celebrate Advent every year. But every year it seems like the world around us rolls straight from Halloween to Christmas. There is no waiting. Our culture has the propensity to drag us from one season of spending to another season of spending. I find it amusing that the media is trying to convince us Christmas won't be the same this year due to the number of products stuck on container ships in the Pacific Ocean. That view misses the point of Christmas. Advent corrects our misplaced ideas!



Advent is about waiting. Advent grounds Christmas in reality. Because the truth is that in many moments in our lives we are waiting. We are waiting for hope in a world that often feels full of uncertainty. We are waiting for love in places where we carry hurt and shame. We are waiting for our world to reflect God's dreams. Advent meets us where we are, amid the darkness and amid the waiting, and reminds us that waiting is not a barrier to God. God acts in the waiting.

This Advent, we wait once again. Waiting is a kind of holy slowing down. How can you engage in this time of holy slow down in a season that is often so busy? Maybe that looks like inviting someone who might be lonely over for dinner or coffee. Maybe that looks like taking the time to notice God in the faces of those you walk past in the store. Maybe that looks like taking a few minutes each morning in prayer, not speaking but just sitting aware of God's presence.

When we take the time to slow down and wait, we begin to see the extraordinary in our every day, the signs that what we celebrate at Christmas is still true today: God's love is here with each of us in each moment of our lives.

We've recently learned about the value of prayer and daily Bible reading. Using the SOAP method of Bible reading can keep us on the disciple's pathway. You're invited and encouraged to use the following Bible passages each day of the month. Here's a quick reminder of SOAP.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- O Observation. As you read the passage ask questions like, "who, what, where, when, how?" What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.


