





Grace Church,

Being a *disciple* and practicing *discipleship* is at the heart of everything we do as a church. Last month I shared this helpful definition of what it means to be a disciple:

A disciple is a person who follows Jesus – to know Jesus and his teaching; to grow more like Jesus; and to go for Jesus, serving others and making new disciples.

With the coming of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2, and because of the faithfulness of these disciples, the gospel of Jesus spread like wildfire. The church of Jesus expanded from Jerusalem, into Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). The story continues all the way up to the present day. We get to join in the great mission of calling on people everywhere to repent, believe in the gospel, and follow Jesus by faith.

As we consider what it means to be a disciple of Jesus, let me offer these 5 traits.

- 1. **Trust**. Disciples believe in the gospel and, by faith, follow the Son of God. Faith is about trust. Disciples take God at his word.
- 2. Love. Disciples live in healthy community with the people of God.
- **3.** Learning. Disciples are shaped and guided by the Word of God. Disciples of Jesus study and embrace the teachings of Jesus. We acquire God's truth and take it to heart in order to experience life change.
- **4. Life Change.** Disciples are yielded to and transformed by the Spirit of God. The character of Jesus is formed in us.
- **5. Service.** Disciples are devoted to and engaged in the mission of God. Disciples serve like Jesus.

How well are you growing in these five traits? Which area is weak? Which is heathy? Don't be afraid to access your walk with Jesus (by the help of the Holy Spirit). Your next faithful step will become obvious to you.

GRACE CHURCH OCTOBER SOAP READINGS


Using the SOAP method of Bible reading can keep us on the disciple's pathway. You're invited and encouraged to use the following Bible passages each day of the month. Here's a quick reminder of SOAP.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- **O** Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.

During October and November, Grace Church will read through the epistles of 1&2 Corinthians. Our reading will help us make sense of these letters and connect what we learn here to the Sunday teaching.



Sermon Series starting in October



In this sermon series Pastor Ron will walk us through the book of 1Corinthians. This significant letter was written by the Apostle Paul in 55 AD. A few years earlier he had founded this church in the Greek city of Corinth. After leaving the church, the apostle Paul heard some disturbing reports about the Corinthian church. They were full of pride and were excusing sexual immorality. Spiritual gifts were being used improperly, and there was a rampant misunderstanding of key Christian doctrines. The apostle Paul wrote his first letter to the Corinthians to restore the Corinthian church to its foundation—Jesus Christ.

Many of the challenges and questions the Corinthian church was dealing with are still present in the church today. Churches today still struggle with divisions, immorality, and with the use of spiritual gifts. The letter of 1Corinthians very well could have been written to the church today and we would do well to listen to its words and apply them to ourselves. 1Corinthians brings our focus back to where it should be—on Jesus. Genuine Christian love is the answer to many problems (chapter 13). A proper understanding of the resurrection of Christ, as revealed in chapter 15, is the cure for what divides and defeats us.

Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes

Something new! The mission committee has decided to try a mission effort that is focused on the Christmas celebration and welcomes the efforts of every member of our Grace Church family.

Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes was started in 1993 by Franklin

Graham, the president of the Samaritan's Purse organization. It was created "to touch the lives of children and families around the world, bringing hope through the Good News of Jesus Christ in the form of a simple gift". The first year they distributed 28,000 shoe boxes. Since then, more than 198 million children in 170 countries and territories have received a shoe box. More than 14.9 million children have made the decision to accept Jesus as their Savior.

Shoe boxes are ready to fill and located in the Sunday School hallway, along with a display of sample items to put in the boxes. To be part of this mission and fill your own box, we have copies of helpful suggestion lists for you to take. The lists are posted on the mission bulletin board near the display. You can use the list to purchase items and place them in the collection box. If you are not able to do the shopping and wish to make a donation, we will be glad to shop for you! If you are crafty, you may want to craft items. These are greatly appreciated. It is suggested to include a note and maybe a picture in each box. Please consider writing a short note. The note will be translated into the child's language.

Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference

It might surprise you to find out the mission budget for Grace includes support for the Native Americans in Oklahoma. The Methodist church has sent missionaries to Oklahoma as far back as the 1800s. Approximately half of Oklahoma was set aside for some 40 different Native American tribes. The numerous Methodist churches within the reservation jurisdiction have been organized into their own Methodist conference. The poverty and issues with drugs have created a community that is in need of support. Grace has allotted \$1,000 per year to help send the message of Christ to this forgotten group of Americans. This is a great place to be part of serving in a mission field within the United States. Something to pray about.
