



Grace Church,

As you receive this newsletter, we are moving deeper into the season of Lent. Traditionally, Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. The six weeks (and 40 days) involve significant actions like confession, repentance, fasting, compassion, generosity, and a plethora of other spiritual disciplines. All of this is right and good and I encourage you to practice all of this.

However, this year I invite you to use the season of Lent as a time of spiritual awakening. Joel, which is one of the primary Biblical resources we use during Lent calls us to an awakening when he writes, "Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God..." (Joel 2:13, NIV). Lent is a season of returning to the Lord, of waking up to his presence and his work in your life, in your church, community, and world.

How can I experience an awakening?

It begins with surrender. Surrender yourself to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We get some clues to awakening when we examine its profound power in the life of Isaiah.

In chapter 6 of his book, Isaiah shows us how awakening occurred in his life and what we can expect. Let me pull a few ideas from Isaiah 6 for us.

- 1. Awakening (surrender) begins with confession. "Woe is me," says Isaiah. He knows his sin in light of God's holiness.
- 2. Awakening continues through forgiveness. When his lips are touched with the hot coal, Isaiah is assured of the forgiveness of his sin and acceptance by the holy God.
- 3. Awakening produces fruit when we say "yes" to God's call. Spiritual awakenings are wonderful moments, yet they only see their purpose when we allow God to use our lives in mission and ministry for his kingdom. Isaiah's response to his own awakening is, "here I am, send me."

Are you hungering and thirsting after more of God? Let this desire take shape during Lent. Here's a simple prayer that might be helpful for you in this season of Awakening.

Father in heaven, it's me (say your name), I want to know you. I want to live an awakened life. I confess I am a sinner. I have failed myself, others, and you in many ways. I know you made me for a purpose and I want to fulfill that purpose with my one life. I want to follow Jesus Christ. Jesus, thank you for the gift of your life and death and resurrection and ascension on my behalf. I want to walk in relationship with you as Savior and Lord. Would you lead me into the fullness and newness of life I was made for? I am ready to follow you. Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with the love, power, and purposes of God. I pray these things by faith in the name of Jesus, amen.


GRACE CHURCH MARCH SOAP READINGS

Using the SOAP method of Bible reading can keep us on the disciple's pathway. You're invited and encouraged to use the following Bible passages each day of the month. Here's a quick reminder of SOAP.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- **O** Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.

During March, Grace Church will read through the Scriptures about confession, repentance, and holiness.

Mi Refugio

Kari Engen gives us some encouraging news from San Pedro, Guatemala. One of the greatest blessings is that the children are back in the classrooms. They have made it through COVID and they are stronger. Home study was not a realistic option for this school. Now that things are seeking a new normal, the work of educating children, (who's actual normal is sharing their family's survival responsibility by searching the city dump), in a Christian environment continues. Kari is excited about a number of projects planned for the summer and is enlisting volunteers to make these projects happen. She ends her 2022 year end letter with this encouraging note. "We may not know what this year will bring us, but one thing is for sure, God will never leave us or forsake us, we will keep our eyes on Him at all times and teach

those in our charge to know and follow our precious Lord."

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes

Grace church sent 112 filled shoeboxes last November to be distributed to children in need around the world. We thought you may be interested in where these boxes ended.



Nigeria is located on the western coast of Africa. It is Africa's most populous country, with more than 250 ethnic groups and hundreds of languages spoken there. Samaritan's Purse began distributing shoeboxes in the country in 1999 and launched The Greatest Journey, our follow-up discipleship program, in the nation in 2013.

A shoebox recipient said, "I learned that there is no friend we can depend and trust so much like Jesus. Because of the love Jesus had for me, He died to save me. I will use this story to tell others the unlimited love that Jesus has for me and for us. I will share with others about the great and wonderful friend I have who is loving, caring, gentle, and at my point of need. All they need to do is to commit their hearts and minds to Him, and He will accept their friend request."

Madagascar is an island nation located in the Indian Ocean off the coast of east Africa. It is known for its lemurs, baobab trees, vanilla, and pepper. Samaritan's Purse began delivering shoeboxes to children here in 1993. Since 2010, they have offered these shoebox recipients our follow-up discipleship program, The Greatest Journey.

Tsodrano, a girl whose name means "blessing" faces many challenges in her village. There is a lack of food, water, and education, and worse yet, spiritual darkness. Yet Tsodrano and her little sister were invited to an Operation Christmas Child outreach event where they received gift-filled shoeboxes. To Tsodrano's delight, among the many fun items in her shoebox was a flashlight! Now, every day when it starts to get dark, Tsodrano turns on her flashlight at the door of her home, so her family and neighbors can all enjoy the light! After a ministry partner mentioned that Jesus, the True Light, had come into their home, 12 of her family members accepted Him as their Lord and Savior and were baptized.

Burundi is located in east Africa and has been known for centuries, in part, for its political instability and violence between the rival Hutu and Tutsi peoples. Samaritan's Purse began distributing gift-filled shoeboxes to

In a very rural and remote village, a grandmother practiced witchcraft and secretly used her grandson in her "business". This young boy, however, received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift and enrolled in The Greatest Journey follow-up discipleship program where he surrendered his life to the Lord Jesus Christ. This broke his grandmother's power over his life and after learning that her spells no longer worked, she also became a believer and now regularly attends church.

Dear family and friends,

We hope this finds you well. As we prepare this letter, the season of Lent is approaching. In the USA, this is often marked by the observance of Ash Wednesday. In the Czech Republic, despite so few people being Christians, masopust ('meat fast') is often celebrated at the



beginning of Lent. In our neighborhood, there is a costumed procession that is fun for the whole family (pictured). It is also an unusually public observance of a Christian tradition in Czech culture.

Thank you for praying for the Czech presidential elections in January. The new Czech president will be retired general Petr Pavel. He will officially take office in March. The election was peaceful and uncontested and brought the largest voter turnout in the history of the Czech Republic. Let's continue to pray that God will raise up political leaders who are men and women of integrity, honor and wisdom.

We have some good news to report about our local church, CB-Smíchov. We have been pleasantly surprised by the improving situation at Smíchov, particularly since the arrival of our new pastor, Pavel Bischof, in September. This is certainly an answer to prayer! Andrew has therefore decided to invest more in helping with the renewal of this congregation, which has been a blessing to us despite its struggles. After Easter we will not continue to help directly with the church planting project in Úholičky, although we remain in contact with our friends there and ask that you join us in continuing to pray for them.

Andrew recently spent a day in Brno with the board and founders of the Via Comenia Foundation to make some important strategic and development decisions. The goal of this organization is the transformation of Czech society through education. Various programs train, inspire, and equip Christians involved in education in the Czech Republic, and recently beyond the Czech Republic with the introduction of training and support for Ukrainian teachers. It has also been able to provide two no-interest loans for building expansion and renovation projects at two different Czech Christian schools. You can learn more about Via Comenia on the website.

The Wholehearted School is facing some decisions as we grow and work to bring the vision to reality. February and March mean webinars and Open Houses for potential new students, and we want to present an honest picture of the school and what we can and can't offer. Amy continues to learn fun vocabulary and dust off her compass and straight edge skills as she keeps at least a few steps ahead of her math students. Her English students have been discussing the school's values. Faith, hope and love are pretty solid, but we'll be practicing pronouncing "curiosity" and "tenacity" for a little while longer.

Thank you for your prayers, encouragement, and support that make our mission in the Czech Republic possible. We are so grateful that you are part of our lives!
