



On Sundays, now through the end of June, Grace Church is exploring the New Testament book of James. Our focus in this practical book is how to live our faith in Jesus every hour and day of the week. One of the big ideas we'll return to time and again is self-discipline. Living for Jesus requires a new way of approaching every moment of life.

Several months ago, I wrote a blog about this. Below are a couple of paragraphs that sets the tone for what James is all about. I hope you'll not only join us on Sunday morning as we take a deep dive into James, but I hope you'll read through that entire letter. "In reading the lives of great men, I found that the first victory they won was over themselves... self-discipline with all of them came first."—Harry S. Truman

Self-discipline determines success. It is the magic bullet to unlock your potential and finally move forward with your life. Self-discipline is the ability to put off what you want at the moment for what you want in the long run. It is a habit of self-regulation for the sake of improvement. Some have said it's the ability to do the things you don't want to do. Are you familiar with the marshmallow experiment? Four-year-old children were each given one marshmallow. They could either eat the marshmallow immediately or, if they waited 15 minutes, could receive another marshmallow. The kids who could wait generally became successful and well-adjusted adults.

In contrast, the kids who quickly ate the first marshmallow had more trouble dealing with stress, frustration, and impulse control. Everyone wants a shortcut on how to be more disciplined. But there isn't one. It is simply a matter of training. It is saying "No!" to the things that waste your life and your time and saying "Yes!" to habits that draw you closer to success.

Replacing your old habits and lifestyle with new ones is crucial.

There are consequences to your actions. If you want new results and positive consequences, change your actions.


GRACE CHURCH MAY SOAP READINGS

Using the SOAP method of Bible reading can keep us on the disciple's pathway. You're invited and encouraged to use the following Bible passages each day of the month. Here's a quick reminder of SOAP.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- O Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.

During May, the SOAP readings will focus on the book of James, his ecclesiastical leadership, and other Scripture which supports his message.

It's always interesting to study how other countries celebrate special Christian events like Easter. Andrew gives us a look at Easter in what they refer to as the non-religious Czech Republic. Most Czechs use this Easter holiday event to travel. This leaves Andrew and Amy at a Sunday worship with a small group of faithful Christians in a special "Celebration of Life." Sound familiar?

The Funkas have spent a major part of their April planning and meeting with other missionaries serving in the Czech Republic. The primary discussion focuses on ways to support local churches to facilitate positive change with the goal of improving the effectiveness of team planting of new churches.

The Wholehearted School continues to grow but the current challenge is recruiting teachers as there have been staff teachers leaving for what Andrew calls, "good reasons."

The Funkas share their appreciation for our prayers, encouragement, and support.

UMCOR is the outreach part of United Methodist Global Ministries. Grace Global Ministries | The United Methodist Church includes UMCOR in its' budget as a separate line item for \$2,300 annually. The UMCOR program has been expanded to include a Mustard Seed Migration program. This new program can be

described primarily as a grant program designed to encourage individual United Methodist churches to engage in ministries to migrants. UMCOR will award grants of up to \$2,000 to churches that create projects or ministries that are focused on migrants and refugees. This is a new and creative way of reaching out to address our countries growing immigration crisis in the name of Christ.


