

Grace Church,

The month of December puts us squarely in the season of Advent – a time of expectation for the coming of Christ. Along with Christians around the globe, we remember the first coming of Christ as an infant in Bethlehem and we anticipate the second coming of the exalted Christ who will bring the Kingdom of God in its fullness to the earth. These are exciting times.

During Advent I like to reflect upon this particular phrase from the Apostles' Creed as it relates to Jesus: *Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary...*

From all eternity the Son is in the Father and the Father is one with Son. But, in the fullness of time, God sent his Son, the expression and extension of his radiance, Word, and glory, into the world. We remember what John exclaimed in the gospel, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God…The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:1-18). Paul agrees with John's theology when he wrote, "the Son is the image of the invisible God…" (Colossians 1:15).

God the Son is born into the world, and although he is eternal God, he takes on human flesh and becomes a man. He is fully God and fully man. He's not half God and half man – not a mixture of two. Jesus is fully God and fully man. God the Son was conceived by the Holy Spirit and clothed in flesh in the womb of Mary.

Advent and Christmas are such important moments in the life of the church. The moments are important not simply because of the nostalgia and celebrations they bring but because of what the season teaches us about our doctrine and belief. We hold up the virgin birth of Jesus so this God-Man comes without sin to save and redeem us from our sin, reconcile us to God and one another, and work in us making us holy and like Christ himself.

The Articles of Religion of the Methodist Church (our theological and doctrinal statements) remind us "that the Son, who is the Word of the Father, the very and eternal God, of one substance with the Father, took man's nature in the womb of the blessed Virgin; so that two whole and perfect natures, that is to say, the Godhead and Manhood, were joined together in one person, never to be divided; whereof is one Christ, very God and very Man, who truly suffered, was crucified, dead, and buried, to reconcile his Father to us, and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for actual sins of men" (Article 2: Of the Word, or Son of God, Who Was Made Very Man).

Let's praise Jesus in this season.


GRACE CHURCH DECEMBER SOAP READINGS

Using the SOAP method of Bible reading can keep us on the disciple's pathway. You're invited and encouraged to use the following Bible passages each day of the month. Here's a quick reminder of SOAP.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- **O** Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.

During December, Grace Church will read through the Scriptures about the birth of the Messiah.

Mission Trip for Hope for Hispaniola

Rina Anderson, Frank and Cindy Fultz returned Saturday, Nov. 19th from a one-week mission trip to Higuey, Dominican Republic serving with the Hope for Hispaniola full time missionaries, Jake and Faye

<u>Vincik and their sons, Christian and Luke</u>. During the short visit, much was accomplished, and both the team members and the Dominicans were blessed. Our team of seven included Bill and Sandi Young from Nicklin UMC and Bill and Lynn Black from Christ UM Church. Some of the work accomplished included purchasing, sorting, bagging, and delivering bags of food staples to 70 needy families in 4 extremely poor villages, two of which were devastated by the recent hurricane. The mostly Haitian villagers and churches have little and most lost



what little they had due to hurricane flooding. Partnering with Pastor Tony and Pastor Ruth, we were connected with some of the neediest of all. We also distributed clothes and toiletries in villages. The villagers were very appreciative, and many hugs and tears were shared.

Two construction projects were completed. One of the workers on the new medical and retreat center has been able to build his family a block home piece by piece over the past two years. A bedroom, living room, and bathroom still had dirt floors although the family has been living there. In two days, our team completed the cementing the floors of those rooms... mixing the "megla" and hauling it by buckets into the rooms. The family stayed with us while the floors were drying. Amato and his family should have moved back into their house on Saturday.

Our team spent one day at La Higuerra visiting the children's center, Benito (a bed ridden man who HFH has been serving for nearly 10 years), Pastora Lydia, and many friends in the community. The men on the team built a small roof on the back of the children's center to help with drainage and prevent leaks that occur during rains.

For a bunch of old people, we were able to accomplish quite a lot. Many friends were made, and two persons committed their lives to our Lord during the service on Sunday at Pastor Tony's church where Bill Black presented the Sunday sermon and gave an invitation for new Christians. All of us want to thank you for your prayers, your donations, and your faithful commitment for Hope for Hispaniola, led by Matt Henderson, a son of Grace UM Church! His parents Ed and Claire were active in this ministry from its beginning and have led many Grace UM Church members in opportunities to serve with them.
