

Happy New Year!

Are you setting any new year's resolutions in 2023? Personally, I don't. I've found that resolutions don't work for me. They don't work for many people. Do you know that new year's resolutions rarely last beyond the beginning of February?

A new piece of ministry that God has called me to in the last five years is the ministry of coaching. A am a certified life and discipleship coach and an Associate Certified Coach through the International Coaching Federation. Coaching is centered on helping individuals, groups, and even organizations, discover their purpose, set significant goals, and create steps to reach those goals. But it all begins with a reason to change. You need a "why?"

New Year resolutions rarely involve a reason – a "why"- to change. We like the idea of losing weight, being patient, exercising more, or getting out of debt. But until the idea moves from "wish" to "I need to..." nothing usually changes.

So, as you think about the next 365 days in front of you, what would you like to see better or healthier in your life? Do you have a goal and firm conviction of how your relationship with Jesus and with your spiritual family can improve in 2023? Where do you see some growth areas? Let me offer a few suggestions:

- Do I practice a daily devotional where I read the Bible, pray, and journal?
- Do I serve out of a love for Jesus?
- Who do I need to forgive, in Christ? Or who do I need to seek forgiveness from?
- Am I worshiping with my church family at least three times each month?
- Am I showing my neighbors or co-workers, by my words, actions, and attitude, that I'm a follower of Jesus?
- Am I growing in my financial generosity?

These are some ideas. Choose one or two, and describe what you see your life becoming if you practiced this for 12 months. Then, set some steps to achieve it. Partner with God and let him work the transformation in you.

- **O** Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.


HOW YOUR MONEY BECOMES MINISTRY

Grace UMC Financial Information - Apportionment

Like all United Methodist Churches, Grace Church pays an Apportionment to the United Methodist Conference. Through this apportioned giving we support all the missions and ministries of the United Methodist Church.

How Our Apportionment Payment to the Conference is Calculated

Through 2019, apportionment had been based on annual salaries and operating expenses. But beginning in 2020 the Conference made a change and began calculating apportionment amounts based on the annual donation income received by the church in the calendar year two years prior. For example, 2020 apportionment was based on 2018 donations. There is a Conference Base Percentage which applies to all UMC churches. This percentage changes each year and in the past 6 years has ranged from 12.94% to 10.6%

Our 2023 Apportionment payment will be \$18,577. This represents 11.1% of the \$167,359 which was received in calendar year 2021.

The graph below shows the Grace UMC Apportionment payments from 2018 through 2023.



Your Mission Giving Options

If you would like to give to the Missions Budget but would prefer that your donation is not applied to the apportionment payment, simply note this on your giving envelope and your donation will go directly to the group of individual missions which are supported by Grace Church. Additionally, if you would like to support a specific mission listed on the Grace Mission Support Budget, simply designate that on your giving envelope.

For a copy of the Mission Support Budget, contact Jerry or Lea Brosius, chairs of the Mission Committee.

Additional Note: The Administrative Council of Grace Church has passed a resolution which states that beginning in January of 2023, any donations which are not designated on the giving envelope will be split 90% to Ministry and Operations and 10% to Missions.
