

"...on the third day, he rose again..." The Apostles' Creed

We believe in the literal and physical resurrection of Jesus from the dead! Matthew concludes his gospel with the women going to the tomb early on the first day of the week only to discover that Jesus was not there. In fact, an angelic messenger points to this reality when he invites the women to step into the tomb and witness for themselves (Matthew 28:1-10). To some, belief in the literal and physical resurrection of Jesus may seem old-fashioned, small-minded, or even ridiculous. But Christians have accepted this reality ever since Mary, Peter, and John ran to the tomb.

The Apostles' Creed, one of the earliest doctrinal statements of Christianity, communicates this truth as an essential Christian belief. Why? Because the resurrection of Jesus from the dead is **THE CENTRAL PROCLAMATION OF THE CHURCH!** The resurrection of Jesus and your belief in it identifies you as a Christian. We follow a risen savior.

To support this statement of faith and encourage you, let me highlight <u>three implications</u> about the resurrection of Jesus.

First, the resurrection of Jesus is the public demonstration of God's victory over sin, death, and hell. The resurrection proclaims the reason for the cross and Jesus' descent into hell. To believe in Jesus does not simply mean to believe that he lived, or even that he was a great ethical teacher – even most other religions believe that about Jesus. The distinctive of the Christian faith is that we believe Jesus is the risen Lord. We believe that his death and resurrection publicly testify to God's victory over sin, death, and hell. (John 10:9, Acts 15:11)

Second, the resurrection of Jesus is the guarantee of our future bodily resurrection. Christianity does not believe that God just saves souls. God is saving ALL OF YOU: your body, soul, mind, and spirit. God redeems the whole person! At his resurrection, Jesus received his resurrection body, just as you and I will at the end of time. In his letter to the church at Corinth, Paul points this out to us. *Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep (1 Corinthians 15:20)*. Because Jesus has been resurrected, we have the promise of our own resurrection. Jesus is the first, the pioneer of our faith, guaranteeing our own resurrection body.

Finally, Jesus' resurrection makes Christianity unique among all world religions. You've heard people say a terribly misleading statement: *all religions are basically the same*. Nothing could be further from the truth. Again, the Apostle Paul teaches that the resurrection of Jesus is the central distinguishing feature of Christianity. He even goes so far as to say that if Jesus has not been raised from the dead then our preaching and our faith are useless (1Corinthians 15:14). If Jesus has not been raised, we are liars, our sins have not been forgiven, and we have no hope for the future. The credibility of the gospel rests on the bodily resurrection of Jesus. Without the resurrection of Jesus, Christianity is no different from any other world religion.

Furthermore, when it comes to the uniqueness of Christianity, we are not spreading religious ideas that inspire the human race to greater positivity. Christianity doesn't help us cope better. We are proclaiming the historical events upon which the entire history of the world is laid. This is about who God is and what God has accomplished.


GRACE CHURCH APRIL SOAP READINGS

Using the SOAP method of Bible reading can keep us on the disciple's pathway. You're invited and encouraged to use the following Bible passages each day of the month. Here's a quick reminder of SOAP.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- **O** Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.

During April, the SOAP readings will focus on the literal, physical resurrection of Jesus, your own resurrection as a follower of Jesus, and the implications of living a resurrection life.



Grace has been a solid supporter of Wesbury United Methodist Community in Meadville for decades and the current Grace representative serving on the Wesbury board of directors is DeAnna Mahle.
