



Happy New Year!

Are you setting any new year's resolutions in 2022? Personally, I don't. I've found that resolutions don't work for me. They don't work for many people. Do you know that new year resolutions rarely last beyond the beginning of February?

A new piece of ministry that God has called me to in the last five years is the ministry of coaching. A am a certified life and discipleship coach and an Associate Certified Coach through the International Coaching Federation. Coaching is centered on helping individuals, groups, and even organizations, discover their purpose, set significant goals, and create steps to reach those goals. But it all begins with a reason to change. You need a "why?"

New Year resolutions rarely involve a reason – a why- to change. We like the idea of losing weight, being patient, exercising more, or getting out of debt. But until the idea moves from "wish" to "I need to…" nothing usually changes.

So, as you think about the next 365 days in front of you, what would you like to be better or healthier in your life? Do you have a goal and firm conviction of how your relationship with Jesus and with your spiritual family can improve in 2022? Where do you see some growth areas? Let me offer-a-few suggestions:

- Do I practice a daily devotional where I read the Bible, pray, journal?
- Do I serve out of a love for Jesus?
- Who do I need to forgive, in Christ? Or who do I need to seek forgiveness from?
- Am I worshiping with my church family at least three times each month?
- Am I showing my neighbors or co-workers, by my words, actions, and attitude, that I'm a follower of Jesus?
- Am I growing in my financial generosity?

These are some ideas. Choose one or two, describe what you see your life becoming if you practiced this for 12 months. Then, set some steps to achieve it. Partner with God and let him work the transformation in you.

- **S** Scripture. Use the ones listed on the calendar
- O Observation. What is God speaking through these verses? What do these verses mean? What do you observe in your reading? Jot these observations in a journal or notebook.
- A Application. How does what you read apply to your life, right now? What is God saying to you? What principles can you apply to your life today?
- **P** Prayer. Close the time in prayerful conversation with God. Thank him for what you learned and for how this applies to you right now.

To begin the new year, we will be reading through the Gospel of Mark. Our SOAP devotionals will correspond to Pastor Ron's new sermon series, "Jesus: Plain and Simple."

A Message from Your Pastor

I learned a long time ago that one of the most important things a leader can do is to tell the truth. Truth is hard. It's hard to speak and people rarely like to hear it, especially when it comes to change. No one likes change except a wet baby! But we need to tell the truth – we need to address the elephant in the room. So please read to the end.

The elephant in the room is the music ministry of Grace Church. No doubt, music is important to worship. Music helps connect us to God and it is one of our responses to God.

Here are just few verses about worship and music. I encourage you to look these up and study them.

Ephesians 5:19 Psalm 105:2 Psalm 150:1-6 Psalm 71:23 2Chronicles 5:13 2Samuel 6:5

Throughout church history multiple forms of music and worship have been practiced. Much of what we call "traditional" worship/music has been around since the nineteenth century. When you look at the composition dates of the hymns this becomes very apparent.

Different instruments have also been used throughout church history. Style, instruments, and words have always been scrutinized. Even the organ, which many congregations praise and value, was once thought to be an inappropriate instrument for worship. In the 1980's the church was even caught up in what we now call the "worship wars." People took sides when it came to styles of music in worship. So glad those days are past us! Aren't you?

As in all things, worship must be grounded in Biblical theology. Worship is a response of gratitude to who God is and what God has done. Worship is praise. Regardless of style. Worship is thanksgiving to God. Biblically, any style will do. There is no one way to worship and no one style of music that God "likes." So long as our worship honors God, it is acceptable.

Grace Church is very blessed to be able to bring a Director of Worship Ministry onboard. This new position is not like the previous position of "choir director." The new position was created to be much fuller and deeper in scope. The primary role of this position is to help everyone at Grace Church (present and future) worship and encounter Jesus. There was specific attention given to respecting what we already do and position us (through modern worship) to welcome new people. Since we are logistically unable to have multiple services right now, the decision was made to create a "blended worship style." This style, commonly used in churches, seeks to bring the best of both traditional and modern styles. This is the direction we are taking and will continue to take. The format we've been using the last couple of Sundays will be our primary format moving ahead.

Now, this does cause challenges. And I have heard your challenges. Not everyone is going to like everything. But I can tell you that for everyone who has told me they do not like what we are

doing, I have had another person tell me they love it. There are many in the congregation who have been waiting. I want to make this transition as easy as possible, that is why we are respecting the things we have done: hymns, organ, prelude, doxology (maybe choir again if you want to participate). But we must add new elements that help others worship, too.

Here is what I am asking: **love**, **listen to**, **and respect one another**. We are brothers and sisters in Christ, first. We all serve Jesus. When we always want our way, we are neglecting to think about that part of our church family who might need something else. I am not asking you to love everything we do. I am asking you to love one another and listen to one another.

On another note, we have to pay attention to the big picture of Grace Church. Things are so much different now than they were 5, 10, or 15 years ago. Attendance has dropped as people have either died or gone elsewhere. We only have a few little kids in Sunday school and church. There are some teens but if we are not careful, we'll lose them too. These are tough times. Good or bad, this is our REALITY!

I was appointed here because there was a deep desire for new things. I have some gifts and skills to help churches re-discover who they are in the 21st century and to create steps forward for health and vitality. What we do in worship will determine how the future of Grace Church goes.

If we only think about our needs, then Grace Church will not last much beyond those who currently attend. But if we think about the future; about people who do not come here yet; about what we can adapt that will help people meet Jesus, then we will be all right and most importantly Jesus will be praised.

Here is what I am asking you to do:

- 1. Love one another. Know that there are other people in this congregation who need these new things. It is not just about you!
- 2. Have compassion for one another. Reach out. Try to understand. Be kind.
- 3. Focus completely on Jesus. He is the center of worship. We will maintain traditional elements that might help you worship. And we will add new elements to help someone else worship. It is about Jesus and it is about "us" together.
- 4. Communicate with love and respect. I am happy to listen. SPRC is happy to listen. We are all doing our best in challenging times.
- 5. We will not be perfect. But we will do our best to honor Jesus in everything. Will you join me in this endeavor?

When we participated in *A Disciple's Path* we learned about worship. In one exercise we were asked to change our perspective about worship. Often our perspective is that we are the audience and worship is about pleasing us. We learned instead that God is the audience, and we act to please God in worship. Let us do that.

Missions

<u>Missions start at home</u> - Each year the mission committee sets aside a portion of mission funds to support projects to help our church family. Grace is blessed with several members with talent and skills to do a lot of small projects. If you are confronted with a crisis and need a friendly hand, consider a "Grace helping hand"; just contact anyone on the mission committee or call the church office. If the project requires minor funding, the mission budget can help.

A big "THANKS" to Ken Wagoner - Ken Wagoner has been a faithful missionary for Christ and Grace Church for some 40 years. Ken is assigned to the University of Pittsburgh campus with the China Outreach Ministries that reaches out to Chinese students that are studying at Pitt. Ken's partner, Rose, has reached a point in her battle with MS where she requires an almost fulltime caregiver so Ken is scaling back his time with COM; sort of a partial retirement. We owe Ken a huge debt of gratitude for allowing us to be part of this ministry that indirectly carried Christ to hundreds, possibly thousands of souls within the borders of Communist China. They really don't get any better than Ken. A big thanks and God's blessings to Ken and his family.

<u>Another successful fund raiser</u> - The Grace Mission Team pulled off another successful fund raiser. Following the weekend of December 5th, we added \$1,412.75 to the mission account. The subtotals were \$680 from the breakfast and vendor table fees, \$325.75 from the sale of crafts from the Grace bazaar table and \$400 from the beautiful hand stitched quilt.

Thanks to all the volunteers that not only sacrificed their time and gave of their talents but did so joyfully. Grace is blessed with amazing Christ filled folks!

<u>Missions Grace Church Supports</u> — Our church is very blessed to be able to support many local missions in addition to the larger international missions that tend to get more notice. We support several Native American organizations such as **The Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference**. Many of these families struggle because of COVID 19 and were thankful for the support they received from churches like GUM. It certainly is a good feeling to hear how our funds were able to help.

The local **Youth for Christ of Venango County** is another organization that couldn't continue their ministry without help from churches like ours. Maybe the most visible mission we support is **The Salvation Army**, both monetarily and the food pantry we help supply with our food donations. These things are all greatly appreciated, and we are very thankful that we have a committed congregation to support these and other organizations.

TV Ministry

The TV Ministry Committee met on December 21 and chose Lightning Strike Productions to complete our video upgrade. Four companies provided quotes for upgrading the video equipment and all quotes are within our budget constraints.

Due to delays caused by COVID and the tremendous increase in video streaming upgrades at schools, churches, and businesses, our upgrade process has been very slow. Thanks to all those wonderful, patient folks



that have continued to support and donate to our TV Ministry. Our plan is to have our video upgrade completed by the end of March 2022.
